

#1 M.I.A.A. and you. Things you should know.

SITUATION 2: Team A begins the game with seven players. The remaining team members arrive after the game has begun and the coach writes their names on the roster and they enter the game at the next stoppage of play after approval by the referee. **RULING:** Legal. Players can be added as long as their names have been listed on the roster, even if the names are added after the beginning of the game. (3-1-3)

"Rosters are open." (FR + JV, if a card fill out!)

Red card given to a player or team bench personnel- list on roster form, fill out student contest disqualification form, remove from match, & do not send from the bench or area.

- ★ The game got away from you?
- ★ Are you surrounded by people that just don't get it?

Any athlete who exhibits signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with a concussion (such as loss of consciousness, headache, dizziness, confusion, or balance problems) shall be immediately removed from the contest and shall not return to play until cleared by an appropriate health-care professional.

★ The responsibility is on the school: Not you. Just follow procedure!

77.2.16 For purposes of obtaining tournament eligibility, no team may exceed four red or thirteen yellow cards during the regular season. Delay of game, encroachment, and deliberate (intentional) handball are all a part of the possible 13 cards!!

Take no prisoners! Seek to communicate of course!! Preventative officiating. Whatever it takes, however, to keep the contest intact.

"The MIAA requires Officials to enforce all Rules regarding unsportsmanlike conduct by coaches and players. There will be no tolerance for negative statements or actions between opposing players, especially trash-talking, taunting, or baiting of opponents. If such comments are heard, a penalty will be assessed immediately. We have been instructed not to issue warnings during the contest. It is strongly suggested that you remind your participants of this policy."

#2 Rules From the book!!

3-3-1c (new): Time for Substitutions: either team may substitute an unlimited numbers of players from the bench:

- a. between periods;
- b. when a goal is scored;
- c. when a player is injured and removed from the field.

Make sure of your numbers before the re-start!!

***12.8.2 SITUATION I:** Player A2, having been cautioned earlier in the game, commits a second cautionable offense. **RULING:** Stop play, show the yellow card, sequentially show the red card to disqualify A2 and do not permit a substitution for the disqualified player.

"sequentially"

This is big. Take your time. I'm sure you needed a lot to go wrong to get there.

In all situations, the removed player(s) may re-enter only after reporting to an official, who shall be satisfied the player's equipment and uniform are in order. There shall be no replacement until the next opportunity to substitute. However, the removed player may re-enter during the dead ball after reporting to an official, who shall be satisfied the player's equipment and uniform are in order.

"Improper Equipment"

1. remove player
2. man down
3. report back at mid-field
4. may replace at "legal time."

12.8.1 SITUATION C: Player A1, being frustrated by his/her own play, directs profane or vulgar language towards himself. The referee issues a caution to A1. **RULING:** Legal. The cautioned player must be removed.

The swear!! Where was it?
Was it heard? Directed at?

SITUATION 12: Player A2 has the ball in Team B's penalty area. Team B's athletic trainer uses foul language to the referee. **RULING:** The referee should apply the advantage clause if there is a clear advantage to Team A. At the next stoppage, the referee should disqualify the athletic trainer. If the referee stops play for the disqualified athletic trainer, the game is restarted because of misconduct with an indirect free kick by Team A from the point where the ball was when the time was stopped. (12-8-3 Situation D)

↓ vs. ↓

On-field free kicks are awarded from the infraction.....misconduct off-field from location of the ball.

SECTION 6 DANGEROUS PLAY

ART. 1 . . . A player shall not participate in dangerous play, which is an act an official considers likely to cause injury to any player. This includes playing in such a manner which could cause injury to self or another player (opponent or teammate).
PENALTY: Indirect free kick.

Not automatic!!
Be patient with it!!
The long slide!!

SITUATION 13: As player A2 begins to take a throw in, Player B2 rushes to get directly on the touchline at the point where the throw-in will be made. **RULING:** Illegal. A player may not interfere with or impede the actions of a thrower and cannot be within two yards of the thrower. Player B2 shall be issued a caution by the referee for unsporting conduct. (15-1-3 Situation)

Doesn't happen all the time. More of a delay!!

SECTION 1 OFFSIDE

ART. 1 . . . A player is in an offside position when nearer to his/her opponents' goal line than the ball, unless:

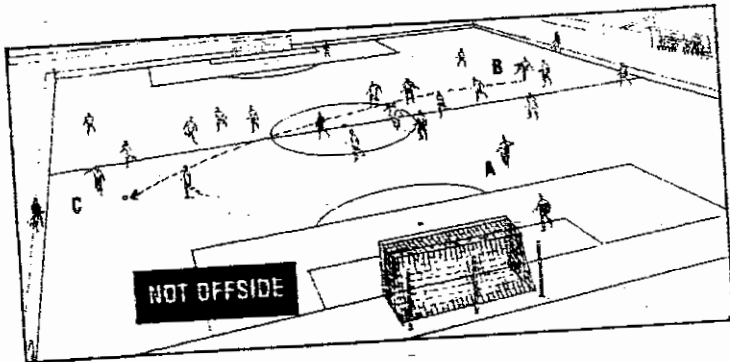
- the player is in his/her own half of the field of play; or
- the player is not nearer to the opponent's goal line than at least two opponents.

NOTE: The position of any part of the player's head, body or feet will be the deciding factor, not the player's arms.

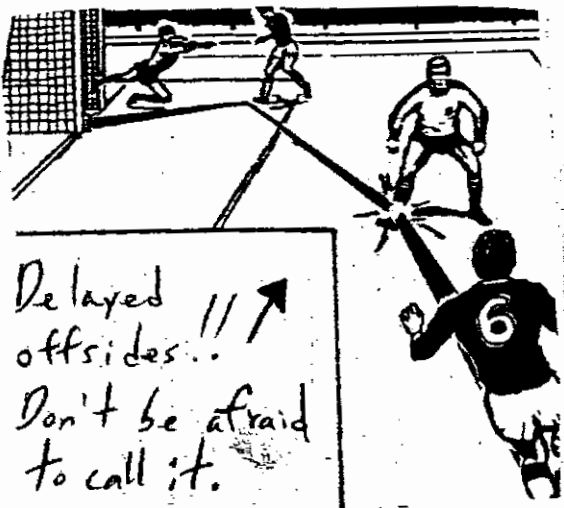

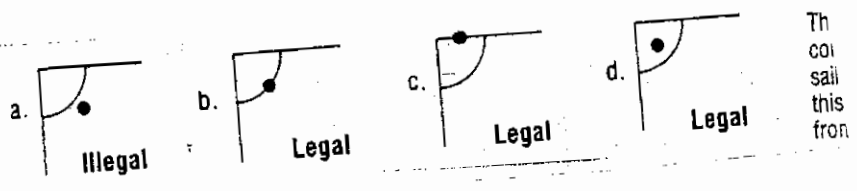


- Reflections still count!!

Mechanics!!!!

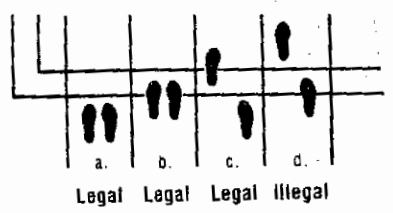
hh. PLAYING DISTANCE - The distance between the player and the ball which the official judges to be adequate to control the ball. It will seldom exceed two steps (six feet).



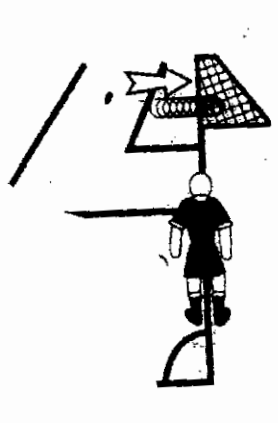
The ball is this far from

#1 Possible obstructions maybe.

- just part of the line.

RESPONSIBILITY FOR DECLARING THE BALL "READY-FOR-PLAY" WHEN A RESTART WHISTLE IS REQUIRED:

Situation	Official
Start of each half	Trail
Kickoff after goal	Trail
Drop Ball	Trail
Goal Kick	Trail
Corner Kick	Lead
Penalty Kick	Lead
Free Kick	Lead
Throw-in	Official responsible for ruling on the legality of the throw.

Delete "and assists." Currently the line reads: "The referee also must signal the timekeeper when the clock is to be stopped and confirm for the scorekeeper the players to be credited with goals and assists."

Let Your Voice Be Heard

Say words such as "Straight up" just before two players go airborne to challenge for a header. If you are close enough that you do not have to yell those words, the players will realize you are in close proximity and are more likely to behave during their challenge. Anything you can do to prevent fouls and keep the game flowing is a benefit to you and the players. □
